FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

The Harrisburg R-VIII Board of Education unanimously voted to place Proposition 1 on the ballot for the April 5, 2016 general election. The school district is asking voters to consider a 67 cent increase to the current operating tax levy. If approved by the voters, this tax increase will be used for the ongoing costs of operating the school district. Harrisburg School District's operating tax levy has not been increased since 1991.

Obviously, since 1991 the cost of operating schools has gone up significantly. Technology acquisition and support, fuel, utilities, teaching supplies, maintenance costs, salaries, benefits, food service, and other expenses continue to climb without adequate funding from the state and federal governments. The cost of educating an individual student in 1991 was \$3,226 per year compared to today's cost of \$8,665 per year.

Your Board of Education, administrators, teachers, and staff have worked hard to keep the district's budget in check while also keeping up with maintaining our expanding facilities, implementing state mandates, and providing top-notch educational opportunities to our students. Budget cuts and other cost-saving measures in recent years offered some temporary relief but have not solved the problem as costs continue to rise and our state and federal governments continue to struggle with providing adequate funding for education. We simply do not have any more cuts to make without impacting instruction, learning environments, and student opportunities.

Spring has sprung! The year seems to fly by once spring break arrives.

Please continue to watch for newsletters from your child's teacher in Friday Folders. The Friday Folder is the best resource for you to keep updated on important dates and events that are coming up in your child's class and school-wide. There are a lot including field trips and other exciting events!

Students in grades 3 through 5 have already begun working hard to prepare for our annual MAP tests. Please read classroom newsletters carefully as testing days will vary per grade level. Grades 3 through 5 tests will be computerized again this year!

Preschool and Kindergarten Screening will be held April 13-15 at the Harrisburg Christian Church. All incoming kindergarteners (must be 5 years old before August 1), all 3-year olds (or children who will be 3 before August 1), and all 4-year-olds not currently enrolled in our preschool (who are not entering kindergarten) should be screened. If your child will be entering kindergarten or is age eligible for our preschool program in August 2016, please call 573-875-0290 to schedule an appointment. The screening process is extensive. Please plan to be at the screening for up to two hours.

We WILL be conducting preschool* and kindergarten enrollment on-site during screening. If you are planning to enroll your child for the 2016-17 school year, please bring the following items with you to the screening:

- Immunization Record
- Birth Certificate
- Social Security Number
- Proof of Residency (piece of mail or voter registration card with name and address on document)

*New students enrolling in our preschool program will be admitted based on qualification and space availability. Determinations will be made in late May or early June.

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS

Extracurricular

Our students have done a fantastic job of getting involved in their school this year. SMART Goal Met

Our middle school teachers meet weekly to track the academic achievement of our students. Part of the process is setting SMART (specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-based) goals. The first semester SMART goal was to have 80% of all students earn a C or higher in all their classes. By the end of the semester the goal had been exceeded with 92% of all students earning a C or higher. Meeting the goal was a great way to demonstrate the commitment of our students and teachers.

HMS in the News

HMS was featured in the Fayette Advertiser on two occasions. In December the paper reported on the efforts of Mr. Barhorst and Mrs. Gipson to bring Hour of Code to HMS. Hour of Code is a nationwide project that aims to give students the opportunity to learn the basics of writing computer code. In November the paper covered eighth grader Lilly Callahan, who won a \$1,000 scholarship for an essay contest.

Spelling Bee

HMS held a spelling bee in January. Students from all grade levels competed in the school-wide event, which was won by Justus Whitaker. Whitaker won the right to represent the school at the regional spelling bee.

Literature Festival

Several students traveled to the University of Central Missouri to participate in a literature festival on March 22. The students met authors and learned about the writing process. The trip, organized by Mrs. Gholson, was a wonderful opportunity for our students to visit a university campus.

IMPORTANT IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 2016-17

Below are important immunization requirements for the incoming eighth graders and seniors for the 2016-17 school year.

<u>Eighth graders</u>: All incoming eighth graders are required to have a Tdap and an MCV immunization before they start school.

<u>Twelfth graders</u>: All incoming seniors are required to have two doses of the MCV before starting school. If the first vaccination was given at 16 years or older they are only required to have one.

SchoolMessenger Notifications

The SchoolMessenger phone notification system, sponsored by the Commercial Trust Company, has been an asset to the school district to keep parents notified of cancellations and upcoming school events. The school's website has a log-in link to SchoolMessenger. Use this link to manage your account and to review messages that have been sent by phone, email, and text message. Can't remember your password or don't have an account? No problem! There is a link to reset the password. Parents who have not set up an account must contact the school first to receive an activation code to be able to set up the account.

A SchoolMessenger tip when receiving notifications by phone is always press "1" (one) when answering the call. Pressing 1 sends a message to SchoolMessenger that the notification has been received and the phone number will not be dialed again.


